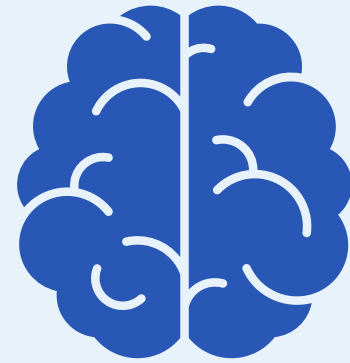
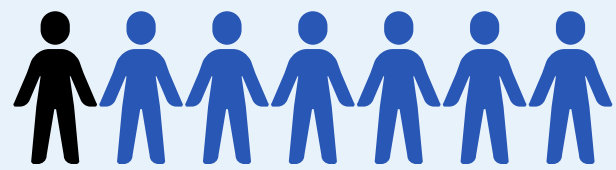


CAG REPEATS OF

USUALLY PROGRESSING FASTER

OF HD CASES ARE LATE-ONSET HD,
DIAGNOSED AFTER AGE 60 AND
USUALLY PROGRESSING SLOWLY
